International Fans travelling to the UK

All international ticket holders aged 11 or older must present proof of a negative Lateral Flow Test (LFT), reported and demonstrated via a text message or email to be allowed entry to Wembley Stadium.

The test (free of charge) needs to be taken within 48 hours of the time gates open (meaning three hours before kick-off). All tests will be self-administered and the result of the Lateral Flow Test must be uploaded using the NHS self-report tool: <https://www.gov.uk/report-covid19-result>

Report a COVID-19 rapid lateral flow test result

Use this service to report your result to the NHS after using a rapid lateral flow test kit to check if you're infectious with coronavirus (COVID-19).

A rapid lateral flow test is a coronavirus test you do yourself. It shows you the result on a handheld device that comes with the test.

Report the result:

- every time you use a rapid lateral flow test kit
- as soon as possible after you get the result

You cannot report a result after more than 24 hours.

You can only report one result at a time.

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Who was the test for?

If you're in the household or bubble of someone who goes to or works at a school: select the "schools" option unless you got the test from your employer or a social care service.

- A social care service (requires UON) - for example domiciliary care, care homes, extra care, supported living, children's homes and day care centres
- A nursery, school, college, university, childcare provider or other education provider
- The NHS as part of staff testing (England, Wales and Northern Ireland only)
- An employer or organisation (not listed above) as part of their testing programme

What is your ethnic group?

This will help us understand how coronavirus is affecting people of different ethnic backgrounds. If you're reporting a result for someone else enter their ethnicity.

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Do you know your NHS number?

It's OK if you do not, you can still continue.

It's 10 digits long, and usually on prescriptions or a hospital or GP letter.

In Scotland, it's known as a CHI number. In Northern Ireland, it's known as an H&C number.

You must insert your mobile number using your international code e.g., +41xxxxxxxxxxx, +35xxxxxxxxxxx. Sometimes a text is not received to international numbers. If you do not receive a text message you will need to use your email as proof of test result
