2022/23 UEFA Women's Champions League – match calendar and access list

Dear Sir or Madam,

We are pleased to provide you with the match calendar and access list for the 2022/23 UEFA Women's Champions League.

Match calendar 2022/23

For ease of reference, the match dates for the 2022/23 UEFA Women's Champions League are as follows:

Preliminary round (if applicable)	27/28 July (Wed/Thu) and 3/4 August 2022 (Wed/Thu)
Round 1 (mini-tournaments)	18 August (semi-finals) (Thu) and 21 August 2022 (final & 3rd place) (Sun)
Round 2	20/21 September (Tue/Wed) and 28/29 September 2022 (Wed/Thu)
Group stage MD1	19/20 October 2022 (Wed/Thu)
Group stage MD2	26/27 October 2022 (Wed/Thu)
Group stage MD3	23/24 November 2022 (Wed/Thu)
Group stage MD4	7/8 December 2022 (Wed/Thu)
Group stage MD5	15/16 December 2022 (Thu/Fri)
Group stage MD6	21/22 December 2022 (Wed/Thu)
Quarter-finals	21/22 (Tue/Wed) and 29/30 March 2023 (Wed/Thu)
Semi-finals	22/23 April (Sat/Sun) and 29/30 April 2023 (Sat/Sun)
Final	3 or 4 June 2023 tbc (Sat or Sun)

Please note that all UEFA's club competition calendars this season have been affected by the FIFA World Cup (21 November to 18 December 2022). The UEFA Women's Champions League match calendar has been drafted in line with the calendar principles that have been agreed for the 2021-25 cycle, while avoiding clashes with other international competitions as far as possible. On two occasions UEFA Women's Champions League group stage matches will coincide with other international competition matches: matchday 2 will be played in parallel with the UEFA men's club competitions group stage matchday 5, while the matchday 3 matches will overlap with two FIFA World Cup group stage matches on each day (one at 17:00 CET and one at 20:00 CET). Note that matchday 5 has exceptionally been scheduled on Thursday/Friday in order to coincide with FIFA World Cup rest days and avoid a clash with the FIFA World Cup semi-final on Wednesday, 14 December 2022.

Access list 2022/23

Please find enclosed the provisional access list that indicates the number of clubs each association is entitled to enter in the 2022/23 UEFA Women's Champions League, as well as the stage at which those clubs would join the competition. The 2022/23 access list enclosed is based on 52 associations entering clubs in the competition, with the positions of the associations in the access list determined on the basis of the five-season association coefficients established at the end of the 2020/21 season, i.e. the cumulative total of the associations' season coefficients from 2016/17 to 2020/21 inclusive.

The calendar and access list will be incorporated into the *Regulations of the UEFA Women's Champions League 2022/23*.

Registration procedure

Registration for the competition will be made in two stages. There will be a pre-registration mid-May 2022 to check the eligibility of each participating club, followed by the final registration at the beginning of June 2022. This deadline will be extended to 20 June (latest) for those leagues concluding in the first half of June. Please also note that to be eligible to participate in the competition, clubs must have obtained a licence issued by the competent national body in accordance with the *UEFA Club Licensing and Financial Fair Play Regulations* and be included in the list of licensing decisions to be submitted by this body to the UEFA administration by the 31 May 2022 deadline.
