	Medical care of players	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Yearly medical examination for senior team in accordance with UEFA Medical Regulations Yearly medical examination for players above age of 12
Infrastructure	Training facilities – availability	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Training facilities available throughout the year and for use by all teams
	Stadium infrastructure	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Improvements to the stadium infrastructure in order to fulfil minimum stadium requirements as defined in the Stadium Infrastructure Regulations
Personnel and administrative criteria	Administrative officer	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Administrative officer who is responsible for running administrative matters of the Club
	Media Officer	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> A qualified media officer who is responsible for media matters including the promotion of the license applicant's activities on social media
	Medical doctor	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> At least one qualified doctor to provide support during training and matches
	Physiotherapist	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> At least one qualified physiotherapist to provide medical treatment and massages for the senior team during matches and training
	Head coach of senior team	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> UEFA A-licensed head coach (or recognised equivalent)
	Youth coach	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> At least one qualified youth coach, with the national association's minimum coaching qualification
